Hours of Operation

Every effort will be made to open the Golf course at 7:00 AM on Saturday, Sunday and holidays, and 8:00 AM on Weekdays for as much of the year as possible. (Normally from the end of May until mid September). The course will remain open until sundown or earlier, at the discretion of the Golf Professional. During the off-season, hours of play will be established by the Golf Professional and the Golf Course Superintendent and the membership is notified by mail and the posting of such in the Clubhouse. The course is normally closed for Member play on Mondays. Members are to cooperate with the requests of the Club Staff when tournaments, inclement weather, and the like mandate changes to normal hours of play.

Practice Facilities

The Driving Range, Chipping Green and Putting Green hours fluctuate throughout the year. Each month operating hours will be posted. Practice areas generally open 1/2 hour before the first tee time and close approximately 1 1/2 to 2 hours before sunset. These areas are for the serious pursuit of bettering one's game and members are requested to be courteous of others using the facilities. The use of "range balls" on the golf course is strictly prohibited.

Ladies Day and Men's Day

On Tuesdays (Wednesdays after a holiday) the golf course is open for women only between 8:30 am and 10:30 am. Men cannot tee off until after 10:30 am. On Thursdays, the golf course is open for men only between 11:00 am and 3:00 pm. Women can tee off before 11:00 am or after 3:00 pm.

Online Starting Time Reservations

From April 1 through October 30th, or as may be determined by the Golf Committee, a starting time request may be submitted via the Fore Tees Online Tee Time Reservation system via the Internet. The reservation system can be accessed through the White Manor Country Club website, www.whitemanorcc.com. The requests may be placed online one week in advance of the requested tee time, and no later than 12:00 noon two days immediately prior to the requested starting time. Reserved tee times will be posted online after 12:00 noon, two days prior to the requested time. 24 hours notice of cancellation is requested if you are unable to use your assigned time.

Handicaps

All golfers are encouraged to establish a handicap for either 9 holes or 18 holes. Assistance may be obtained in the pro shop. USGA rules for handicapping shall apply. A minimum of 5 scores is required before a handicap can be established. At the completion of a round of golf, the score must be entered on the computer in the pro shop or online from your home computer. **All** scores (18 holes or front or back 9 holes) must be entered!

The purpose of the handicap system has always been to attempt to level the playing field of golfers of differing abilities, so that those golfers can compete equally. For example, imagine someone whose average score is 92 trying to compete against someone whose average score is 72. Without a handicapping system, it can't be done fairly.

With a handicapping system, the weaker player is given strokes on certain holes on a golf course. ("Dots" on the scorecard represent these strokes.) On a particular hole the weaker player may be allowed to deduct a stroke from her score for that hole. At the end of the round, the two players of differing abilities can figure their "net scores" – their gross scores minus the strokes they were allowed to take on certain holes.

Dotting Scorecards

The pro shop will provide "dotted" scorecards to all players participating in a tournament.

| Handicap | Strokes |
|----------------------------------|---|
| 1 to 18 | 1 "dot" or stroke on the number of holes equal to handicap. |
| For example, a 12 handicap would | get 1 stroke on handicap holes 1 through 12 & none on handicap holes 13 through 18 |
| 19 to 36 | 1 "dot" or stroke on all 18 holes plus a second "dot" or stroke on as many holes as handicap exceeds 18. For example, a 28 handicap would get 1 stroke on handicap holes 1 through 18 plus 10 additional strokes on handicap holes 1 through 10. (10 holes would have 2 "dots" and 8 holes would have 1 "dot.") |

Simplified Golf Etiquette

Don't move, talk or stand in line of sight when a player is addressing or stroking the ball.

Be certain players in front are out of range before hitting the ball.

Don't loiter; play briskly.

Signal players behind you to play through when delayed or when you get an open hole in front of you.

Leave the green immediately after play.

Never improve your lie unless you are playing "Winter Rules (6 inches in your own fairway).

Be certain you are playing the correct ball.

Don't carry more than 14 clubs.

Don't replace a damaged ball without permission of your opponent.

Don't change balls on the green.

Replace and repair all divots with the proper tool (caddie master can give you one) before moving on.

Maintain extreme care on and around the green with equipment, flagstick, etc.

Be sure to properly rake the bunkers and leave the rakes in the bunkers.

Golf Dress Code for Women

The following dress code must be adhered to while on the golf course or at any of the practice facilities:

- Sleeveless shirts are acceptable, but halter tops, tank tops and spaghetti straps are not acceptable.
- Length of shorts is no shorter than three inches above the knee.
- Jeans, cutoffs or jogging outfits are not acceptable.
- Bathing attire is not permitted.
- Golf shoes must have non-metal spikes only.

Women's Golf Fee

All women golfers will be charged a fee of \$75.00. This one time seasonal fee pays for the cart fees, continental breakfasts and lunches at the Opening Day tournament on May 20th and the Closing Day tournament on September 16th. It also provides prize money for those two tournaments and the weekly Tuesday (or Wednesday) tournaments.

Tuesday Morning Golf Program

Tuesday mornings are reserved for the women of White Manor to play golf between the hours of 8:30 and 10:30. Men are not permitted to tee off until after 10:30. Women have two options on Tuesday (occasionally Wednesday) mornings:

Option 1

Play 9 holes or 18 holes at your preferred time. You can schedule a tee time between 8:00 and 11:30. Use the “Foretees” program on the club website or call the pro shop. The pro shop can also assist you in finding playing partners.

Option 2

Participate in the 9-hole or 18-hole tournament format of the day. (Descriptions and sign-up procedures for all the formats are detailed in this booklet.) If you want to participate in the tournament, you must notify the pro shop before you tee off so that an official scorecard can be made for you. When you are finished playing, return the scorecard to the pro shop. When all participants have completed their rounds and turned in their scorecards, the pro shop will determine the winners. The winners will be notified by the end of the day and their names and scores will be posted in the locker room.

Please note: While tournament participation is encouraged, it is optional. Tournament participants and non-participants can play together in the same group at any time.

Prizes

There must be a minimum of 6 participants for prizes to be awarded for an 18-hole tournament. There must be a minimum of 3 participants for prizes to be awarded for a 9-hole tournament.

For individual formats, prizes will be paid in pro shop credit which can be used for the purchase of merchandise or for golf lessons.

Partnership and team formats will have cash prizes.

Ties

Tied scores in any tournament will be broken by a match of cards, as per USGA rules.

Mentor Program

Experienced women golfers will volunteer to be available as “mentors” every Tuesday (or Wednesday) morning. If you are new to the game and would like to play with a “mentor,” you can request one when you schedule your tee time. The “mentor” will play 9 holes or 18 holes with you and explain golf etiquette, cart management, clarify golf rules and scorekeeping, etc.

Ringer Board

The Ringer Board (located in the women's locker room) is a way to visually demonstrate your course successes. Everyone, regardless of level of play, can track her progress at White Manor.

After Opening Day, each participant will enter her first complete 18-hole score (or 9-hole, if preferred) on an index card which will be kept in a file box in the women's locker room. Based upon this first round score card, use an appropriately colored push pin to record your score for each hole on the Ringer Board ***if you have a double-bogey or better.*** (If you have higher than a double-bogey, leave the space blank.)

For each subsequent round, check your scorecard against your Ringer Board card. If you **improved** on any holes, simply erase the previous numbers and change them to your new scores on those holes. *Change only those scores that are BETTER.* (If you did worse on any hole, do not change your ringer board card for that hole.) Replace the push pins on the Ringer Board with new colored ones to represent the improved scores.

By using the Ringer Board, a player builds her ***best game over the season.*** There will be Ringer Board awards at the Closing Day luncheon for the players with the best overall scores in each flight.

The flights (based on Opening Day handicaps) will be as follows:

- A Flight – course handicaps of 15 or less playing from the **green** tees
- B Flight – course handicaps of 16 to 25 playing from the **green** or **blue** tees
- C Flight – course handicaps of 26 to 35 playing from the **green** or **blue** tees
- D Flight – course handicaps of 36 or higher playing from the **blue** tees

Women in the B and C Flights must declare at the beginning of the season the tees, green or blue, from which they choose to compete in the Ringer Board competition. You may do so by placing either a **green** or **blue** pin to the left of your name on the board.

Important exception! If you get an Eagle or a Hole-in-One from either the **green or **blue** tee (even if it is not your declared tee), you may enter this score on your Ringer Board card.**
