Golf Course Care Rules

The Board of Directors and the Greens and Golf Committees decided to protect our course more actively. Effective May 1, 2009, the following local rules are in effect:

Who?

All Members and Guests All members and their guests are asked, respectfully, to please respect our golf course and its condition. No one is excused from this responsibility. Members are expected to educate their children regarding these simple rules. Actions of children or guests will be attributed to the Member.

While individuals are personally responsible for their care of our course, each foursome will name a "captain" responsible for that group's repair of the course and following of related rules.

What?

Reduce Damage to Course Each golfer should:

- ◆ Replace divots or use sand-seed mix,
- ◆ Repair ball marks,
- ◆ Rake bunkers; and
- ◆ Obey cart rules;

Golfers identified as not respecting or repairing the course will be brought before Good & Welfare. Specific penalties, established by the Board in advance and applicable to all, will be imposed. Those guilty of offenses will be disciplined and all such disciplines will be publicized to the membership; for two-three-foursomes, offenses will be treated the same as existing "slow play" rules (all will be penalized).

Member discipline progression:

- ◆ First offense – a verbal warning and re-education on course care
- ◆ Second offense – a one week suspension of golf privileges
- ◆ Third offense – a one month suspension of golf privileges
- ◆ Fourth offense – suspension until the next season (May 1st)

When?

Repair Damage Quickly Repair ball marks on greens when you arrive on the green, before marking your ball. Get in that habit.

Replace all divots taken from fairways and tee boxes. If the divot is shredded or nonexistent, use the sand & seed mix to fill the hole completely.

Rake bunkers after use; please leave the rake inside the bunker.

Avoid damaging our course whenever possible. If your cart does damage, please report it to the Pro Shop.

Where?

Fairways, Tees, Greens Respect the course everywhere. Repair damage on Tees, Fairways, Bunkers, and Greens.

Why?

Because You Love Golf As a living, breathing piece of property, our course deserves your attention to preserve it for the long term. Your fellow golfers deserve your respect for the immediate term. It is the player's duty to leave the course as they found it so those playing behind can enjoy the same conditions.
